AGREEMENT

relating to the attribution of the
ISF U15 World School Sport Games 2023
in Brazil

BETWEEN

INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL SPORT FEDERATION,

an international non-profit organisation, incorporated and existing as "*association internationale sans but lucratif*" under the laws of Belgium, with registered office at Rue Archimède 59, B-1000 Brussels, Belgium, and with (CBE) registration number 0476.233.673,

duly represented by Mr. Laurent Petrynka, ISF President,

hereinafter referred to as "**ISF**"

AND

Brazilian Federation of School Sport,

the national school sport association, incorporated and existing as "*association déclarée*" under the laws of Brazil, constituted and recognised as representative body for school sport in host country Brazil, with registered office at SCN, Quadra 01, Edifício Central Park, Sala 108, Asa Norte, Brasília DF, CEP 70711-903Brazil,

duly represented by Mr. Antonio Hora, President,

hereinafter referred to as "**CBDE**" or the "Local Organising Committee" or the "**LOC**"

Both aforementioned hereinafter jointly referred to as "**Parties**" and separately as "**Party**".

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PREAMBLE

Whereas ISF as international school sports governing body, recognised by the International Olympic Committee, aims to promote school sport in all its forms as an educational tool for the physical, intellectual, moral, social and cultural development of school students, to convey the Olympic spirit and the values of peace, friendship, solidarity and fair play, without discrimination of race, colour, gender, sexual orientation, language, religion or philosophical beliefs, politics or other opinions, of origin, physical aspect, wealth, language, birth or any other situation, and aims to facilitate contacts between school sport groups and to cooperate with national and international institutions, federations, associations with similar objectives;

Whereas to that end, ISF organises, promotes, monitors and supervises various competitions and international sports events, amongst which the ISF Gymnasiade U15, also known as the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, a bi-annual multi-sport event for school students below 15 years, which will be held in 2023 in Brazil;

Whereas for the organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games in 2023, ISF has received proposal from Brazilian Federation of School Sport to organize and host this event in Brazil in 2023.

Whereas the CBDE, the national school sport association, constituted and recognised as representative body for school sport in Brazil, has applied as candidate to host and organise the ISF U15 World School Sport Games 2023 in Brazil and has presented its candidacy at the ISF Executive Committee in September 2021.

Whereas, the CBDE has subsequently submitted a strong candidature dossier with a description of Venues, Competition Sites, Accommodation, Educational and Cultural Programme and a global Budget planning (hereinafter referred to as the "LOC Bid Book" attached as Annex D) to the ISF Secretary General;

Whereas the ISF Executive Committee in its meeting held on 16 September 2021 has decided, as a consequence of the foregoing procedure and based upon the undertakings and representations made in the LOC Bid Book, that the **organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games is attributed to and to be effectuated by CBDE** as Local Organising Committee (hereinafter: the "LOC");

Whereas it is the mutual desire and aim of the Parties that the ISF U15 World School Sport Games shall be organised with the utmost care and in the best possible manner and takes place under the best possible conditions for the benefit of the world school sport movement and to that end, this Agreement, including all Annexes which shall form integral part of it, set forth the terms and conditions of agreement between ISF and the LOC with respect to the hosting and organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games;

Whereas the LOC accepts and engages to respect its obligations resulting from this Agreement which covers the entire period of the preparation (as from the decision to attribute the ISF U15 World School Sport Games), the Event itself (with next to the sports championship competitions also accompanying educational, cultural and social events) and the follow-up (until the reports are made and all payments are settled);

THEREFORE, in accordance with the foregoing, the Parties have agreed as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

The capitalized terms used in the Agreement shall have the usual and customary meaning, known by the LOC as ISF Member, as set out in the Annexes, in the ISF Statutes, the ISF Regulations or the ISF Requirements, or shall have the specific meaning as hereinafter in the Agreement defined and agreed between the Parties.

2. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

2.1 Event specifications

- (a) ISF U15 World School Sport Games 2023

The official title of the event will be "ISF U15 World School Sport Games – Brazil 2023".

Short name of the event will be "ISF Gymnasiade U15, Brazil 2023"

- (b) Event location(s)

The ISF U15 World School Sport Games will take place in Brazil.

The LOC will propose to the ISF the name of the city in which Event will take place in writing at least 60 (sixty) calendar days after the signing of this contract and decision has to be validated by the ISF MC.

The LOC guarantees that no other similar sport school events or activities will be held in the country while the ISF U15 World School Sport Games is taking place.

If the LOC intends to amend the locations referred to above, this must be requested in writing at least 180 (one hundred and eighty) calendar days before the start of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and approved by the ISF Management Committee (MC) and validated by the ISF Executive Committee (EC).

- (c) Event dates

The ISF U15 World School Sport Games will take place from 2023 to 2023.

If the LOC intends to amend the Event dates, this must be requested in writing at least 180 (one hundred and eighty) calendar days before the start of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and approved by the ISF MC and validated by the ISF EC.

- (d) Competition Sports

There will be 14 sports: athletics, badminton, basketball, basketball 3x3, chess, football, judo, karate, orienteering, swimming, table tennis, taekwondo, volleyball and wrestling.

The LOC has the right to propose up to 5 additional sports.

2.2 Attribution – Commitment

ISF hereby entrusts the LOC with the hosting and organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and the LOC - regardless of its own organisational structure and/or involvement of Brazilian government authorities - agrees to assume that responsibility towards ISF and accepts to honour, abide by, perform and complete at its own cost and expense all of the obligations, undertakings and representations set out in this Agreement, in its current and to be added Annexes which form an integral and inseparable part of it, in all applicable ISF Statutes, ISF Rules, ISF Regulations and ISF Requirements, which may be amended, modified or supplemented by ISF to ensure that the organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games is executed with the utmost care and in conformity with most recent standards and practices and with the rules and regulations of the relevant international sport federations.

The LOC commits itself to making every effort to guarantee and ensure the full and proper execution of the entire hosting and organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and the LOC shall be held responsible when this result cannot be reached, fully discharging the ISF of any liability in relation thereto.

The LOC undertakes to obtain the Government Guarantees from the competent Brazilian government authorities as well as all necessary governmental decrees, licenses, permits, grants, orders, decisions and other acts required for the organisation and hosting of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and shall undertake all measures necessary to ensure at all times the highest level of infrastructure and administrative support and collaboration from the local and national government authorities in connection with the Event.

The LOC undertakes and guarantees that the hosting and organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games will be held and conducted in accordance and conformity with the Olympic spirit, with the values of peace, friendship, solidarity and fair play, without discrimination of race, colour, gender, sexual orientation, language, religion or philosophical beliefs, politics or other opinions.

The LOC shall, in accordance with the Government Guarantees and with assurance of the collaboration and support from the competent Brazilian government authorities, at all times guarantee and be fully responsible for the general security, safety and personal protection of all Event participants and the LOC shall at all times guarantee the highest possible level of security and protection of the integrity of all persons attending the Event during their entire stay in host country Brazil and guarantees that no responsibility whatsoever in this respect can be imputed or apportioned to ISF.

The LOC as ISF Member acknowledges having knowledge and understanding of and to abide and respect the ISF philosophy, ISF Statutes, ISF Rules, ISF Regulations and ISF Requirements (the "ISF Documents") in its hosting and organising of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games.

2.3 Event licence fee

In consideration for the attribution of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and for the rights and licences granted herein, the LOC commits to pay to ISF an event license fee of the net amount of 1.000.000 EUR (one million euro), free and clear of currency control restrictions, bank charges or transactional costs, at the bank account of ISF:

ISF licence fee shall be paid:

- 50% of full amount (500.000 euro – five hundred thousand euro) latest 15 days upon signing of the contract;
- 50% of full amount (500.000 euro – five hundred thousand euro) latest until the 30th April 2022;

This event licence fee shall be deemed to have been earned and acquired by ISF on the date payment is made or due and shall not be refundable under any circumstances, including any event of Force Majeure.

The LOC shall be responsible for the payment of any withholding or other taxes or governmental charges associated with the event license fee; if the LOC would be required by any applicable law to withhold or deduct an amount by way of withholding or other taxes or governmental charges, the LOC shall be required to gross up the payment so that the net amount of the event license fee (to be) received by ISF is in any way 1.000.000 EUR (one million euro), as if no withholding or deduction had been or to be made.

3. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

3.1 The elementary rights and obligations of ISF

The elementary rights and obligations of ISF in relation to the ISF U15 World School Sport Games include but are not limited to the following:

1. Liaise and consult with the LOC on all practical aspects of the Event, nominate an official ISF Delegate dedicated for the Event, and provide assistance, guidance and cooperation to the LOC, remotely before and on site during the Event, in order to ensure a successful Event;
2. Determine the Competition Rules and the format of the Event and establish all rules and policies related to sport and disciplinary issues during the Event;
3. Determine all rules, policies and arrangements related to broadcasting, marketing, merchandising and the use of official Event logos on Event merchandise (for sale) and team uniforms;
4. Inform all the Member countries with ISF Bulletins and via the ISF Website, promote the Event towards its Members, in order to attract as many participating school athletes and teams as possible, and provide LOC with the contact details of all National School Sport Authorities whose teams will participate in the Event;
5. Provide an efficient Electronic Registration System of Accreditation (ERAS) and check the accreditation process,
6. Collect the accommodation advance deposit, payable at the time of registration, and transfer the deposits to the LOC in accordance with Clause 17.2;
7. ISF shall be exclusive and sole owner of all Media and Broadcasting Rights worldwide regarding the Event, but grants a licence to the LOC for use in the territory of the host country Brazil, solely in relation to and for the purpose of the Event.
8. Provide an evaluation and final Event report within 12 weeks after the close of the Event.
9. ISF and its staff shall not in any form make any statements or behaviour that may constitute interference in sovereign politics or be detrimental to the image of the host country or its government.

3.2 The elementary rights and obligations of the LOC

Unless otherwise provided and specified in this Agreement and/or the Annexes, the LOC shall exercise its rights and fulfil all its obligations in accordance with this Agreement at its own cost and expense; all costs in connection with the organisation and hosting of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, including but not limited to arrangement of Venues and Sport Sites, security, medical services, communication and (local) transport requirements, anti-doping control, catering, educational and cultural programme and ceremonies, shall be borne by the LOC.

Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Agreement, as well as the commitments set out in the LOC Bid Book, the elementary rights and obligations of the LOC in relation to the ISF U15 World School Sport Games include but are not limited to the following:

1. The LOC shall organise, under supervision of ISF, the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, including the various sports competitions, Official Events (such as Opening Ceremony, Medal Award Ceremony, Closing Ceremony, Farewell Party, Charity Gala), the Educational and Cultural Programme, and all other social activities in connection and association with the Event that will bind all participants with the local culture of Brazil and foster international exchange of young people, which are required and agreed in accordance with Annexes A and D;
2. The LOC shall provide sufficient and qualified staffing to run the Event and cover all the organisational working areas and shall dedicate as many responsibilities as possible to young volunteers;
3. The LOC shall provide, at its own cost, the necessary Competition Sites and Training Sites with capacity, technical qualifications, facilities and equipment, stipulated and approved by ISF; the LOC accepts the involvement of technical delegates from the International Sport Federations concerned in the preparation and supervision of the Competition Sites and Venues;
4. The LOC shall develop and enrol a plan/system, through the use of accreditation cards, software or similar means, that determines controlled and regulated access and/or admission to transportation, Competition Sites, training sites, Venues, Accommodation, catering, cultural and/or social event locations ("Controlled Access Sites"); ISF staff will have open and unrestricted access to all areas of the Event; ISF also reserves the right to make, remove or make invalid any accreditation issued for the Event;
5. The LOC shall offer free transportation to, within and back from the official ports of entry via public transport and/or with Event branded buses, shuttles, vans or cars to all participants and accompanying delegation members (such as teachers, coaches, trainers) from their arrival until their departure, between the (air)port or train station of arrival, Accommodation sites, Competition Sites, training sites and those other Event Venues and locations where sport, cultural or social events shall be held; the LOC shall not be responsible for bearing the costs for the international travel of the participants to the Event, unless otherwise agreed in the LOC Bid Book;
6. The LOC shall provide free catering (3 meals/day) for all participating and/or accredited persons, as well as healthy and varied meal packages and special catering for specific dietary requirements, including allergies;
7. The LOC shall provide offices, conference and meeting rooms (including the necessary infrastructure, equipment and furniture) and facilities for delegation and technical meetings, VIP facilities, media centre, press conference room, anti-doping control rooms and other technical or required facilities mentioned in Annexes A and D;
8. The LOC shall provide free internet access (preferably wireless network) at all Event Venues;

9. The LOC shall provide on-site first aid medical facilities and services at no charge to all the participants at all Competition Sites, as well as free adequate medical hospital services in the immediate vicinity of the Competition Sites and Accommodation locations for treating injuries and illnesses, as well as foresee a medical evacuation plan; basic first aid services should be at no charge to participants available starting 1 ½ hours before competition until the close of competition each day (30 minutes after conclusion of last match);
10. The LOC shall cooperate with the national Brazil Anti-Doping Agency and shall provide all required rooms, materials and staff for taking anti-doping control samples, which shall be analysed at an accredited independent laboratory;
11. The LOC shall provide and submit an elaborated detailed advertising, promotion and communication action plan, within 60 (sixty) calendar days after the date of signature of this Agreement for approval by ISF, and shall prepare the promotion starting 6 (six) months prior to the Event and shall ensure publicity of the Event in local press and media interests (TV, newspapers, radio);
12. The LOC shall provide and submit an elaborated detailed Event merchandise and marketing plan, within 60 (sixty) calendar days after the date of signature of this Agreement for approval by ISF;
13. The LOC shall submit a detailed sustainable Budget for the Event to ISF at the latest 90 calendar days prior to the start of the Event;
14. The LOC shall provide the broadcasting of the Event and shall contract at its own cost and expense a TV Production/SNG company who can produce the required video and audio coverage signals; the LOC shall use all the communication channels of ISF to broadcast livestreaming;
15. The LOC shall respect and shall cause its own sponsors and national product or service providers (the "LOC Partners") to respect the commercial interests, visual identity, visibility and Marketing Rights (jointly: the Commercial Rights") of ISF's sponsors and international product or service providers (the "ISF Partners") and of ISF itself;
16. The LOC shall be responsible for the entire organisation and hosting of the Event and shall at all times at least comply with the "Minimum requirements to organise ISF School Summer Games" (Annex A) and the LOC Bid Book (Annex D), unless otherwise would be agreed and approved by ISF in an additional Annex or addendum to this Agreement;
17. The LOC shall communicate on a regular basis with the ISF staff, the ISF Delegate to the Event and the TC President (or, in case of his absence, the TC Delegate);
18. The LOC shall arrange staffed and Event branded welcome desks to provide information and transportation services at the (air)ports and train stations of arrival, in the Venues, and at all official hotels to all participants.

4. INFORMATION AND CONTROL

4.1. Reporting

The LOC shall submit every 3 months written progress reports to ISF describing the status of progress of preparation and execution of the plans for organising and hosting the Event. In case of problems in connection with the organisation of the Event, the LOC must immediately inform ISF. The LOC commits itself to follow any instructions and advice from ISF concerning all organisational and technical matters in order to be at all times compliant with all ISF Documents.

4.2 Quality control and evaluation inspection visits

ISF shall at all times, with 24-hour prior notice, have the right to inspect and control whether the LOC is fully compliant with all ISF Documents and to visit all Sites and Venues related to the Event for the purpose of verifying the quality of the preparation and execution activities with respect to the infrastructure as well as all of the organisational and technical aspects.

Following such visit, the Parties shall establish a State of Findings report describing the state and the quality of the infrastructure and any points of improvement in relation thereto. The LOC commits to addressing and remedying these points of improvement within a reasonable remedy period that shall be agreed between the Parties. In case the LOC fails to comply with this obligation, this shall be a breach of this Agreement.

ISF shall in any way organise at least three full evaluation Inspection Visits.

The LOC shall cover the costs related to the evaluation and inspection visits and quality control in general.

5. BOARD AND LODGING ACCOMMODATION

The LOC shall ensure that for all participants to the Event suitable and sufficient board and lodging Accommodation shall be available on time and in an appropriate manner in the form of hotel rooms, housing or other types of overnight stay facilities in the vicinity of and/or at maximum 30-minutes distance to the Competition Sites.

- Athletes to be accommodated in a maximum of 4-bedded room (no gender and no nationalities mixed);
- Coaches, officials, journalists, additional adults in a 2-bedded room (no gender and no nationalities mixed);
- VIP guests, Heads of Delegation, ISF Staff, ISF Delegate in a single room.

The LOC shall negotiate favourable conditions and contract with hotels for sufficient hotel room nights during the Event to meet the accommodation requirements of all participants to the Event. The agreements between the LOC and the Hotels (or any other type of accommodation) shall particularly provide that the number of rooms to be held for actual use during the Event may be reduced without penalty and that no guarantees or deposits must be made in advance of the Official Opening of the Event. Notwithstanding ISF's right to make the final selection of the hotels and to review and approve each such hotel or accommodation agreement, it shall have no contractual liability to any party in relation thereto.

Participating delegations or individual participants and their accompanying teachers/trainers (and other persons attending the Event) will pay directly to the LOC fee for accommodation and all meals 50 euros per day.

ISF will not be responsible for any costs of board and lodging accommodation or catering expenses.

LOC shall ensure and cover for all ISF officials suitable and sufficient board and lodging in single rooms.

6. PROTOCOL

It is the responsibility of the LOC, under supervision of the ISF, to organise protocol ceremonies, including but not limited to: the Opening Ceremony, Closing Ceremony and cocktails, Awarding Ceremony, Farewell Parties, Gala Dinner, and all in accordance with the Handbook.

The LOC shall provide facilities for meetings with Heads of Delegation and technical meetings, such as those with coaches and sports officials, as well as special services and facilities to persons accredited as VIP.

The LOC will finance and organise the charity Gala Dinner for the benefit of the School Sport Foundation. ISF, VIP's, Officials, ISF technical commission and staff, one member of each delegation and any other people should be invited by the LOC for this Event. The LOC must provide the gala details including fundraising system and venue to ISF for validation.

7. OFFICIAL EVENTS AND CULTURAL/SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

Official Events are all Ceremonies and educational, cultural and social events and activities in connection and association with the ISF U15 World School Sport Games which are required by ISF in accordance with Annex A or are set out and committed in the LOC Bid Book in Annex D.

Other organisational and/or social events and activities in connection and association with the ISF U15 World School Sport Games which the LOC would like to stage at its own request, require prior approval of ISF.

All Official Events shall take place in Controlled Access Sites provided by and under the full access and operative control of the LOC, in collaboration with the competent government authorities and ISF. No other entity and/or organisation other than the LOC and/or ISF shall have the right to organise Official Events or cultural or social activities in connection with and referring to the Event. All Official Events and cultural or social activities organised by the LOC are subject to prior approval by ISF. This includes but is not limited to the content and the duration of such activities.

Official Events may neither be of political and/or religious nature nor make any active or passive reference to politics and/or religion. The LOC shall ensure that no third party abuses an Official Event for commercial, promotional, political and/or religious purpose.

Any commercialisation (including but not limited to exploitation of Commercial Rights, Media Rights, Marketing Rights or Broadcasting Rights, generating revenue or having any commercial or promotional association) of the Official Events must be in compliance with ISF Requirements and is subject to prior approval by ISF.

The content and the performers of any kind of entertainment must not conflict with the ISF Philosophy nor with the Commercial Rights and interests of ISF Partners.

The LOC and ISF shall in due time decide on the admittance policy and on the allocation of invitations in accordance with the ISF Requirements.

Unless otherwise agreed with ISF, the LOC shall ensure that the Controlled Access Sites and all other Event Venues are available for use free and clear from any and all advertising, brand identification and commercial activity in any form not directed or approved by ISF ultimately five (5) working days prior to the start of the Event and until twenty-four (24) hours after the day of the last use. The requirement of being free of advertising include, without limitation, that there shall be no advertising, signage or other commercial indicators on any stands, scoreboards, seats, staff uniforms, accreditations, fences or

elsewhere inside or surrounding the Controlled Access Sites and all other Event Venues, other than (from ISF Partners and LOC Partners) approved by ISF.

For the avoidance of doubt, no other entity, government authority and/or organisation other than the LOC and/or ISF shall have the right to organise Official Events in connection with the ISF U15 World School Sport Games.

8. ACCESS - ACCREDITATION - TICKETING

The LOC shall at all times be fully responsible for the planning, management and operation of access control to all Controlled Access Sites in collaboration with the competent government authorities and/or or private security companies.

Accreditation shall set forth the system according to which access to Event Sites and Venues as well as specific appropriate areas thereof may be granted to (categories of) persons officially connected with the ISF U15 World School Sport Games in accordance with the specific function of these individual persons (such as athletes, trainers, delegation members, ISF or LOC officials, medical staff, VIP, etc.)

All persons, not ERAS or otherwise officially Accredited by ISF and the LOC, wanting to attend certain sport competitions or Official Events may only access the Competition Sites and/or other Controlled Access Sites after having granted that right by means of Ticketing.

The LOC shall fully comply with and implement the Ticketing and hospitality policy set forth in the ISF Requirements and the Parties shall detail seating plans of the Competition Sites, related Ticket prices, if any, and terms and conditions of purchase and use of Tickets, including specific arrangements for ISF Partners and LOC Partners, who may be allowed to use and distribute Tickets for promotions as a premium or give away or prize in a competition or sweepstakes.

The LOC shall be responsible for the announcement, promotion, printing and delivery of invitations, Tickets and other printed material for Official Events subject to ISF's prior approval and ISF's Requirements and directives.

The LOC is entitled to the revenues, if any, from all Tickets that have been regularly sold. The LOC has indicated and committed in the LOC Bid Book that Tickets for attending sports competitions shall be free of charge or price.

If the LOC becomes aware of abuse, unauthorised advertisement, or unauthorised commercial use of Tickets, it shall bring this information immediately to the attention of ISF. The LOC shall take every necessary measure in order to prevent abuse of Tickets in any way, such as scalping, unauthorised Ticket sale, distribution, resale, sweepstakes and commercial promotions of third parties not having been granted any such rights.

All personal customer data in connection with the Ticket management, sales and/or distribution shall be collected and stored by the LOC in accordance with applicable law and the Ticket Terms and Conditions. Insofar as legally allowed, all collected personal customer data remain the sole property of the LOC, who shall have no commercial exploitation rights other than for the Event and who shall share the collected personal customer data with ISF, if required and requested by ISF, in line with Clause 12.

9. DATA PROTECTION AND GDPR

The LOC shall comply with the regulations on personal data protection and the LOC shall not process or treat any personal data received from or through ISF in connection with the Event, in particular the personal data of all participants, other than in compliance with EU Regulation(EU) 2016/679 of the

European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) as published in the Official Journal of the European Union.

For processing purposes by ISF with personal data shared by the LOC (e.g. in relation to Ticketing in accordance with Clause 7 above), the LOC warrants to have the authority to provide personal data to ISF and warrants that such personal data have been processed in accordance with this Clause 12.

10. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

The ISF hereby grants to the LOC a non-exclusive and non-assignable licence to use and display the ISF logo, the name “**International School Sport Federation**”, the abbreviation “**ISF**”, the tagline “**We are school sport**” and the reference to the ISF Website www.isfsports.org (the “ISF Marks”) but only to the extent related to and required for the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, as permitted under this Agreement. ISF may, at its sole discretion, direct the LOC on how these rights are to be used, exploited and protected and the LOC shall promptly observe and comply with all reasonable instructions or directions issued by ISF. The LOC is not allowed to modify, alter or obfuscate the ISF Marks and shall avoid any action that might affect or diminish their value.

No other rights with respect to the ISF’s Intellectual Property Rights are conferred, either expressly or by implication, upon the LOC. The LOC shall, at its own cost and expense, take all necessary steps to protect and maintain ISF’s interest and its Intellectual Property Rights, including without limitation, filing any and all declarations of use and other evidences that may be required during the term of the Agreement.

The LOC hereby represents, warrants and undertakes to respect and not infringe, and to cause all LOC Partners not to infringe, any of the existing intellectual property rights of ISF Sponsors and ISF Partners.

ISF hereby represents, warrants and undertakes to respect and not infringe, and to cause all ISF Partners not to infringe, any of the existing intellectual property rights of LOC Sponsors and LOC Partners.

11. ANTI-DOPING

The LOC recognises the importance that ISF places on the fight against doping in school sport and its support for the WADA World Anti-Doping Code. The LOC undertakes to organise sufficient doping controls during the Event and to comply with any ISF Regulations and directions given by ISF in relation to anti-doping practice and procedures to be adopted in relation to the ISF U15 World School Sport Games.

The LOC shall provide for the necessary rooms and materials for anti-doping control, as well as trained staff to take the samples in collaboration with the national Braziln Anti-Doping Agency. The analysis of specimens of samples shall be made at an accredited state-of-the-art laboratory approved by ISF and/or WADA.

12. MEDIA AND BROADCASTING

12.1 Media

The LOC shall provide and make available, at its own cost, the necessary infrastructure and facilities, detailed in the ISF Requirements and in the LOC Bid Book, to be used by the Media for their work in connection with the Event, including a Main Press Centre (MPC) combined with an International

Broadcast Centre (IBC). The LOC shall ensure that all ISF Requirements on Media will be entirely complied with, using the most advanced utilised technology at the time of the Event. ISF may at all time issue guidelines and directives in order to ensure that the Media infrastructure and facilities meet with the requirements of the Media and the technical and organisational state-of-the-art level.

12.2 Broadcasting

The LOC shall provide video/audio coverage of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games for broadcasting of the Event and shall contract at its own cost and expense a TV Production/SNG company, to be approved by ISF, who can and shall provide the technical equipment and staff necessary to register and produce the required video and audio coverage signals (sound and picture for the video signals and audio signals for sound) of all sports competitions, finals, Ceremonies and Official Events. The LOC shall fully cooperate with the TV Production/SNG company and fully assist in the coordination of the logistical requirements for its activities at the Controlled Access Sites.

ISF shall be exclusive and sole owner of all Media and Broadcasting Rights worldwide regarding the Event, but grants a licence to the LOC for use in the territory of the host country Brazil, solely in relation to and for the purpose of the Event: the LOC may grant a Local Broadcaster the right to broadcast the Event on a live or delayed basis inside the host country Brazil via over-the-air and cable television ("Local Broadcasting Right") and to retain revenue received from such grant.

All necessary clearances which may be required under the laws of the host country Brazil shall be obtained by the LOC at its own cost to ensure that the images of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games are cleared for full exploitation of the Media and Broadcasting Rights of ISF, worldwide in any media, and for the LOC in the territory of the host country Brazil.

ISF shall be entitled to retain all revenues generated from the exploitation of the Media and Broadcasting Rights.

The LOC shall take all steps ISF may deem necessary to preserve and protect ISF's Media and Broadcasting Rights and shall refrain from any action, and shall in particular refrain from entering into any agreement or executing any document, which might result in an infringement of ISF's Media and Broadcasting Rights.

13. COMMERCIALISATION

ISF shall be exclusively entitled to all international Marketing Rights, whereas national Marketing Rights within host country Brazil shall be licenced to and held by the LOC but subject to ISF's prior approval and the ISF Requirements.

Within 60 (sixty) calendar days after the date of signature of this Agreement, ISF and the LOC shall determine and agree upon the practical arrangements on branding, advertising and merchandising by respectively ISF Partners and LOC Partners, the structure relating to sponsorship and rights granted to respectively sponsoring ISF Partners and sponsoring LOC Partners and, in general, the exploitation of the respective Marketing Rights of ISF and the LOC and the partition and distribution of revenues generated by such exploitation.

The LOC shall respect the visibility and visual identity of the sponsoring ISF Partners and of ISF itself and shall address the global ISF Partners - under the guidelines set annually by ISF - through all Event communication, including but not limited to bulletins, posters, website, Facebook, etc. Sponsor logos of ISF Partners and LOC Partners must be included on all forms of printed or digital media/advertising.

The LOC and ISF shall make sure that there are no incompatibilities between their respective commercial Partners and that difficulties, if any, shall be solved in due time. The Parties shall also liaise and cooperate to prevent and/or terminate any ambush marketing of the Event.

In its merchandise and marketing plan for approval by ISF (see Clause 3.2 - point 12), the LOC shall confirm that and elaborate how it will:

1. develop Event logo(s), mascot, slogan, etc. for use on all promotional materials, signage, Event merchandise and marketing information. The final materials are to be approved by ISF;
2. provide a branded welcome package with guide/handbook, and at its discretion branded gift items;
3. provide teams and individuals ISF-branded trophies and medals for the participants at podia;
4. provide the participants with a branded certificate.

14. BRIBERY

The LOC shall not engage in bribery or corruption in any form and shall have a zero tolerance approach to breach whether it involves private individuals or public officials. The LOC shall never solicit, accept, agree to receive, promise, offer or give a bribe, facilitation payment, kickback, or other improper payment. All the LOC's activities are managed in full compliance with this Agreement, the ISF Requirements and all applicable legal and regulatory anti-bribery and corruption obligations.

The LOC shall comply with and shall ensure that all the employees and any persons performing services for or on its behalf including sub-contractors and service suppliers comply with the applicable legal and regulatory anti-bribery and corruption obligations. The LOC and any persons performing services for or on its behalf including sub-contractors and service providers shall keep accurate books, records, invoices and accompanying documentation available for inspection by investigating authorities for compliance with any applicable anti-bribery and corruption laws and regulations.

If ISF notifies the LOC that it suspects that there may be a breach of this Clause or any applicable legal and regulatory anti-bribery obligations, the LOC agrees to respond promptly to ISF's enquiries, to cooperate with any investigation and to allow ISF to audit books, records, and any other relevant documentation.

ISF shall be legitimately entitled to terminate this Agreement immediately upon written notice to the LOC and to recover from the LOC the amount of any loss and costs resulting from such termination if, in connection with this Agreement:

- (a) the LOC, or any employee or any person performing services for or on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the LOC), accepts, solicits, agrees to receive, promises, offers or gives a bribe, facilitation payment, kickback or other improper payment;
- (b) the LOC, or any person employed by it or performing services for or on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the Licensee), breaches the anti-bribery and corruption policy of this Clause or commits an offence under the applicable anti-bribery and corruption laws or regulations.

If any breach of this Clause is suspected or known, the LOC shall notify ISF immediately.

If ISF notifies the LOC that it suspects or knows that there may be a breach of this Clause or any applicable legal and regulatory anti-bribery obligations, the LOC agrees to respond promptly to ISF's

enquiries, to co-operate with any investigation and to allow ISF to audit books, records, and any other relevant documentation. This obligation shall continue after the termination or expiry of this Agreement, and shall survive such termination or expiry for whatever reason.

Where there might be any dispute, difference or question arising in respect of the interpretation of this Clause, the decision of the ISF Executive Committee shall be final and conclusive.

15. BETTING

The LOC shall, with the support of ISF and the government of host country Brazil, use its best endeavours to prevent any form of betting on ISF U15 World School Sport Games competitions or matches and to prevent any manipulation of the outcome or course of any competitions or matches in connection with betting activities and, without limitation to the foregoing, the LOC will comply with any directions given to it by ISF relating to preserving the pure sporting integrity of the Event in the face of betting.

16. ORGANISATION

16.1 Education and social commitment

The LOC will allow young volunteers from all Brazilian territories to be responsible for various duties, supervised by an adult, in a Young Officials Program, in order to:

- get the local community involved and attend the sports competitions;
- welcome the participating students and provide a programme enriching and cultural activities that will bound the delegations with the local culture and foster international exchange;
- provide an innovative approach of education throughout the entire ISF U15 World School Sport Games;

The Young Officials, accompanied by a team of Physical Education and Sports (EPS) Teachers from high schools in the Region, shall be involved in the organisation and course of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games. These teams will be deployed on the Competition Sites and other Event Venues.

16.2 Communication

In its communication action plan for approval by ISF (see Clause 3.2 - point 11), the LOC shall confirm that and elaborate how it will:

1. prepare and organise the promotion starting 6 (six) months prior to the Event;
2. establish and maintain contact with local, national and international media before, during and after the Event, including issuing regular press releases;
3. provide a system of live-scoring of game results displaying them on the playing fields for different sports;
4. provide a daily bulletin with results and planning of the following days, in due time and by 10 p.m., local time, at the latest;
5. provide a system for communication among staff between all Competition Sites, Venues, transportation and accommodation sites;

6. provide a system for communication to communicate with the Head of Delegations in the Event of all relevant information and emergencies.

17. FINANCE

17.1 Entrance fee

ISF shall apply and levy an entrance fee of 50 EUR (fifty euro) per person participating in the Event. (Non-affiliated members will be charged 100,00 EUR (one hundred euro) per person.) This entrance fee shall have to be paid to the ISF at the moment of registration of all participants and accompanying delegation members via ERAS, the ISF website or otherwise.

17.2 Accommodation advance deposit

ISF shall also apply and demand a deposit of 100 EUR (one hundred euro) per person per night as advance deposit for lodging accommodation. The LOC acknowledges and accepts that this accommodation advance deposit shall be paid directly to the ISF. ISF and LOC will make agreement about transferring the deposit to the LOC, with possibility of reducing it for the amount of ISF entrance fee/levy, no later than _____ 2023.

17.3 General terms of understanding on costs and revenues

All costs related to the organisation of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, such as but not limited to infrastructure, equipment, staff, security, local transport, catering, promotion, media coverage, etc.) shall be borne by the LOC and/or governmental authorities of the host country Brazil, with no responsibility whatsoever for ISF.

Any revenue generated from regular ticketing sales, local sales of merchandising and sponsoring by LOC Partners, approved by ISF, belongs to the LOC.

Any revenue generated from international sponsoring and international broadcasting of the Event belongs to ISF.

Any revenue generated by the LOC from granting a Local Broadcasting Right to a Local Broadcaster belongs to the LOC.

The LOC, neither ISF shall be responsible for bearing the costs for the international travel of Event participants to and back from Brazil.

17.4 Taxes

All taxes, duties or other levies which are imposed directly or indirectly by statute, directives or in any other binding legal form on either Party as a direct or indirect consequence of the Event shall be borne by the LOC.

The LOC shall provide ISF with a written, unconditional and binding guarantee of the Brazilian Ministry of Finance, and/or such other competent governmental authorities with jurisdiction over the assessment, determination, collection or imposition of any taxes, duties or other levies as the case may be:

- that host country Brazil and any national or local governmental authority having jurisdiction over the assessment, determination, collection or imposition of any taxes, duties or other levies

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shall not directly or indirectly impose any kind of taxes, duties or other levies on ISF, which shall be treated as tax-exempt entity;

- that ISF does not constitute a permanent establishment in host country Brazil, nor is it in any other way subject to taxation in Brazil.
- that the exploitation of ISF's Marketing and Broadcasting Rights shall not subject ISF to any kind of taxation in Brazil.
- that host country Brazil shall not levy any kind of withholding taxes, source taxes or other taxes on payments to and from ISF.

All taxes, duties or other levies which are imposed directly or indirectly by statute, directives or in any other binding legal form on either Party as a direct or indirect consequence of the Event shall be borne by the LOC.

17.5 Financial audit of accounts

The LOC shall keep complete, clear and accurate books, which are in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles. All books, accounts, invoices, receipts, minutes, correspondence and other administrative documents and data of the LOC relating to the ISF U15 World School Sport Games shall (at request of ISF) be open for audit examination by ISF and/or by independent auditors or certified accountants selected by ISF, in particular for the purpose of verifying compliance by the LOC with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. ISF shall give prior written notice to the LOC at least three (3) calendar days before such audit examination shall take place. The inspection costs of the auditors or accountants shall be borne by ISF.

The LOC shall render all necessary assistance and cooperation to facilitate such audit inspection and shall instruct its employees and members to act accordingly.

A full final report will be submitted by the LOC to ISF within sixty (60) days following the last day of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games, in which the LOC shall provide ISF with all financial and other information, with an audited financial statement including a profit and loss statement with respect to the entire ISF U15 World School Sport Games and with a general report on all its activities.

18. LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

18.1 Liability and indemnification

ISF shall not be responsible for any claim or loss, injury or damage arising out of the preparation, organisation, conduct or cancellation of the Event or incurred by participants of the Event or by visitors or spectators attending the Event.

The LOC, and not ISF, shall be solely responsible for any such claim or loss, injury or damage and the LOC shall have no recourse against ISF in relation thereto. The LOC shall indemnify, defend and hold ISF, including its officers, directors, members, employees and ISF Partners, harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, costs or expense (including all attorney's fees and legal proceedings costs) which may be claimed from them.

The LOC shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless ISF, including its officers, directors, members, employees and the ISF Partners, from and against all liabilities, obligations, damages, losses, claims, demands, recoveries, deficiencies, costs or expenses (including all attorney's fees and legal proceedings costs) arising out of the performance or any breach of this Agreement or the ISF Documents by the

LOC or any act, omission, neglect or default of the LOC, its officers, directors, employees and LOC Partners in connection with the Event.

ISF shall only bear contractual liability arising from a fraudulent act or gross negligence and tortious liability arising from a wilful misconduct or omission.

In case of termination of this Agreement by ISF or in case of cancellation or abandonment of the Event for any reason whatsoever, the LOC hereby renounces and waives any claim and right to any form of indemnity, damages or other compensation and hereby undertake to indemnify and hold harmless ISF, its officers, directors, members, employees, consultants, agents and other representatives, from any third party claims, actions or judgments in respect of such termination, cancellation or abandonment. It is the responsibility of the LOC to notify all parties with whom it contracts of the content of this Clause.

This Clause shall survive termination of this Agreement.

18.2 Insurance

All Event participants or delegations will be responsible for their own personal insurance, international travel insurance, luggage insurance, legal protection insurance or any other insurance they might deem necessary.

In order to ensure a consistent sufficient level of liability insurance protection, the LOC undertakes to subscribe at its own expense and maintain during the entire term of this Agreement and the Event the following insurance policies with recognised, financially sound and reputable insurance companies of international standing for adequate coverage of:

- general contractual and extra-contractual (tort) liability of the LOC and all its (sub-)contractors, service providers and suppliers;
- product liability regarding Event merchandising products;
- property damage concerning buildings, infrastructure, equipment and materials;
- car insurance of all vehicles, buses, shuttles, vans or cars used for transfers and people transport during the Event in Brazil (covering at least injuries and death resulting from car accidents);
- sport accident insurance for Event participating individuals and teams including medical expenses in Brazil and assistance and repatriation to home country (in excess/second line of their own insurance if they have one, or in first line if they do not have);

The LOC shall ensure that all its (sub-)contractors, suppliers and service providers have appropriate third party liability insurance covering the LOC and ISF (as named insured) to cover all potential claims for injury and damage resulting from their actions or negligence while providing services to the Event or from the failure of any facilities or products provided by them in the course of the organisation of the Event.

The LOC shall also subscribe at its expense a cancellation and abandonment insurance policy with an insurer of recognised international standing with adequate substantial coverage of all risks of loss and/or damages and/or costs resulting from Force Majeure, cancellation, postponement/advancing or boycott of the Event.

The LOC shall ensure, to the extent possible, ISF, its officers, directors, members, employees, consultants, agents and other representatives, are included as insured in the aforementioned insurance policies.

19. GENERAL PROVISIONS

19.1 Termination and Force Majeure

The rights granted under this Agreement shall remain in effect for a period ending on 31st December 2023, except if specified otherwise in this Agreement or agreed otherwise in an Annex to this Agreement.

“Force Majeure” shall be any unforeseen event or situation which is beyond the reasonable control of the Parties and which prevents performance of this Agreement in whole (not in part) by either party, including, without limitation, floods, earthquakes, hurricanes, epidemics, war (declared or undeclared), riots, insurrections and every situation that seriously threatens, puts at risk or endangers the safety, wellbeing, health or even life of the Event participants.

Events not considered and expressly excluded by the Parties as events of force majeure: fire, strikes, labour disputes, the unavailability of means of transportation in the Region.

If an event of Force Majeure occurs, performance of the Parties' obligations under this Agreement (save the duty of payment by the LOC of the event licence fee described in Clause 2.3) shall be suspended for the duration of the delay caused by the event of Force Majeure and the period of performance shall be automatically extended, without penalty, for an equal period.

If an event of Force Majeure occurs, the Party affected by it shall promptly inform the other Party to this effect in writing, explaining its reasons for invoking Force Majeure. Subsequently, the Parties shall immediately consult with one another with a view to finding an equitable solution and shall use all reasonable efforts to minimise the consequences of the occurrence.

If the conditions of Force Majeure prevail for more than 3 (three) months and the Parties have not been able to find an equitable solution, each Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, without penalty or damages to be paid to the other Party. The event licence fee described in Clause 2.3 shall remain definitively acquired by ISF.

This Agreement cannot be terminated by the LOC for any reasons other than Force Majeure, lasting longer than 3 (three) months. If the LOC breaches this Clause, it shall pay to the ISF liquidated damages in an amount of 500.000 EUR (five hundred thousand euro) for such unlawful termination breach, notwithstanding the right of ISF to claim higher compensation on top of the aforementioned liquidated damages in case of proven higher damages.

Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Clause, ISF shall have the right at any time during the duration of this Agreement to terminate it forthwith by sending a written notice of termination to the LOC specifying the reasons for the termination, if any of the following events occur:

- i. the LOC materially breaches any of its obligations under this Agreement and, notwithstanding a written request from ISF to rectify the situation, refrain from such breach in the future or, if possible, to prevent such a breach from occurring in the future, fails to comply with such a request;
- ii. the LOC fails to make any payment required under this Agreement when the same becomes due and payable or when the LOC ceases to carry out its operations;
- iii. the LOC fails to comply with a request of the ISF to correct any defect or to attain the required quality under the ISF Requirements; or

- iv. an event of Force Majeure (as defined above) prevails for a period of more than 3 (three) months and the Parties have not been able to find an equitable solution pursuant to the Agreement.

Upon the termination of this Agreement pursuant to this Clause, any amounts accrued, due and payable hereunder shall be paid forthwith by the LOC to ISF. In no way will such amounts be withheld by the LOC due to a dispute arising out of or in relation to this Agreement or to initiate any claim for damages made by the LOC. Termination of this Agreement pursuant to the present Clause shall terminate, effective and immediately, all rights and licences granted by ISF to the LOC. The LOC shall not assert any claims or rights to damages against ISF and the LOC shall indemnify ISF and/or other concerned parties in line with Clause 18.1.

19.2 Non-assignment

The LOC is not entitled to assign, pledge or otherwise dispose of its rights or obligations under this Agreement to a third party without the prior consent of ISF.

If the entire business (or any part thereof) of the LOC would be transferred to a third party, the rights and/or obligations of the LOC under this Agreement shall pass to such third party only with the prior written consent of ISF.

The LOC is not authorised to grant sub-licences without the prior written consent of ISF.

19.3 Construction of the Agreement – Annexes – ISF Documents

This Agreement, together with and including its Annexes, contains the entire Agreement between the Parties and any amendments, additions or deletions thereto shall be agreed in writing by both Parties.

However, the LOC as ISF Member acknowledges having knowledge and understanding of and to abide and respect the ISF Documents in its hosting and organising of the ISF U15 World School Sport Games and agrees that it shall adhere to the terms and conditions set forth in the latest version of the ISF Documents which shall be made available to the LOC on the ISF intranet or otherwise. ISF has the right to modify or change the content of the ISF Documents on an ongoing basis in accordance with its proper governance and in accordance and compliance with most recent standards and practices of the International Sport Federations, recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and members of SportAccord. The LOC commits to abide by, and apply, the content of the ISF Documents as they may be changed from time to time. The LOC hereby accepts that ISF is, therefore, entitled to amend, delete or supplement the terms of any of the ISF Documents and/or to add ISF Requirements at all times at its sole discretion. The LOC shall adapt to any such amendments, deletions, supplementations and additions. Should, however, any such amendment, deletion, supplementation or addition result in a significant material adverse effect on the financial situation of the LOC, the LOC shall within thirty (30) days of receipt of the respective ISF Documents notify ISF in demonstrating such significant material adverse effect. ISF and the LOC shall then jointly and in good faith address such significant material adverse effect and discuss potential solutions satisfactory to both Parties.

The LOC agrees and accepts that, in case of conflict between the provisions of the ISF Documents and the provisions of this Agreement, the ISF Executive Committee shall have the ultimate and sole authority to decide which provisions will prevail and be applicable.

Whenever impossible, the provisions of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be valid and enforceable under the applicable Belgian law. However, if one or more provisions of this Agreement are found to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, in whole or in part, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein. Moreover, in such an event, the Parties shall amend the invalid, illegal or

unenforceable provision(s) or any part thereof and/or agree on a new provision, in such a way as to reflect insofar as possible the purpose of the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision(s).

Any failure or delay by a Party in exercising any right under this Agreement, or any absence of reaction by a Party in the event of violation by the other Party of one or more provisions of this Agreement, shall not operate or be interpreted as a waiver (either express or implied, in whole or in part) of that Party's rights under this Agreement, nor shall it preclude any further exercise of any such rights. Any waiver of a right must be express and in writing.

All notices required under this Agreement must be in writing and delivered or sent to the receiving Party by hand through a reputable courier service or by registered mail. All other forms of communication required under this Agreement must be in writing and sent by e-mail.

19.4 Confidentiality

No party shall release, publish or otherwise distribute, nor authorise or permit any person or entity to release, publish or distribute, any information regarding (a) the financial arrangements included herein, (b) any non-public terms pursuant to this Principle Agreement, or (c) any of the documentation or drafts of documentation among the Parties, except as shall be required to perform obligations hereunder, enforce rights or remedies hereunder, or as may be required by law.

19.5 Governing law – Dispute resolution


All issues, questions and disputes concerning the validity, interpretation, enforcement, performance and termination of this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with Belgian law.

All difficulties (issues, questions and disputes) encountered shall be firstly submitted to a Mediation Panel, which includes the ISF President, or his representative, one member of the ISF Management Committee and 2 members of the LOC. The Mediation Panel can, at the request of either Party, be presided by a professional mediator appointed by both Parties. The expenses related to such professional mediator presiding of the Mediation Panel will be borne by both Parties in equal amounts.

All disputes, including any claim arising out or relating to this Agreement or breach thereof, of which the amount in dispute exceeds 1.000.000,00 EUR (one million euro) shall be finally settled under the ICC Rules of Arbitration by a panel of three arbitrators appointed in accordance with these Rules. All cases in which the amount in dispute does not exceed or is equal to 1.000.000,00 EUR (one million euro) shall be referred to a sole arbitrator and shall be settled in accordance with the Expedited Procedure Provisions of the ICC Rules. The seat of arbitration shall be Brussels, Belgium. The arbitration shall be conducted in English.





Dear School Sport Colleague,


